





Primary Diagnosis of AOT Participants at Baseline



Baseline Assessments by FY & Quarter (N = 201)




Past 30 Day Institutional Involvement Over Time



Emergency room visits for psychiatric reasons declined from 25% → 5% (80% reduction)

Homelessness decreased from 7% → 3% (57% reduction)

Employment Status of AOT Participants Over Time




Full-time employment increased from 3.3% → 10.7% (224% increase)

Part-time employment increased from 3.9% → 8.0% (105% increase)


Unemployed, looking decreased from 21.1% → 17.3% (18% reduction)
