

Hospital Emergency Department (ED) Bridge Clinics and Consult Services

Hospital emergency department (ED) bridge clinics and consult services provide immediate care for people experiencing substance use-related crises.

Patients receive rapid assessment, treatment, medications, peer support, and connections to ongoing treatment and recovery services in their communities.



What do ED bridge clinics and consult services offer?



Provide rapid treatment to individuals experiencing a substance-related crisis.



Facilitate timely initiation of medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD).



Connect with peer support specialists who provide compassionate care through recovery coaching.



Provide linkage following discharge to ongoing community-based treatment and reconvey services.

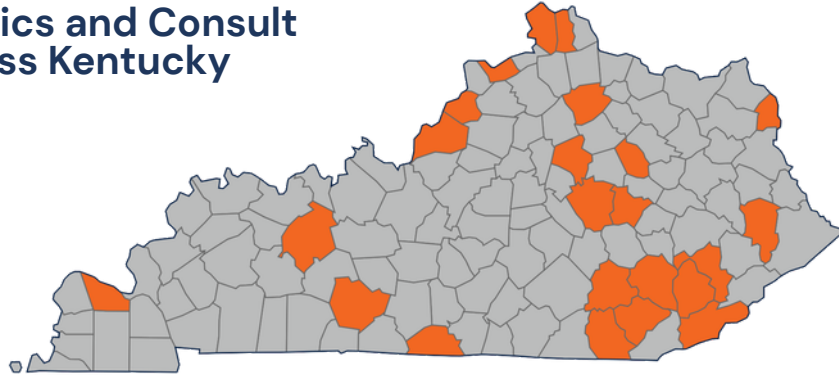
