OUR AUDIENCE

The Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities Kentucky School Virtual Learning Series Planning Committee invites submissions of presentation proposals for the First Annual Kentucky School of Alcohol and Other Drug Studies Virtual Learning Series. Series attendees will include primary care providers, hospitalists, substance use treatment staff, clinicians, harm reduction staff, prevention specialists, addiction educators, childcare providers, Family Resource & Youth Services Center staff, adult & juvenile justice staff, community-based services staff, public health staff, interested community members, and people with lived experience.

SEEKING DIVERSE SUBMISSIONS

To ensure diverse representation, we invite individuals and organizations from a variety of settings – including academia, non-profit, private sector, government agencies, healthcare systems, and provider agencies, as well as individuals with lived substance use experience – to submit proposals for presentations focused on enhancing the system of care for all Kentuckians. We are seeking current and relevant educational opportunities that may fall within these topic areas:

- Evidence-based & Promising Practices
 Across the Continuum & Lifespan
- Co-occurring Disorders
- Psychopharmacology/Pharmacotherapy
- Co-occurring Medical Issues/Integrated Care
- Harm Reduction

- Cultural Humility & Demographic-Specific Services
- Recovery & Peer Supports
- Workforce Development & Retention
- Process Addictions (e.g. gambling)

PROPOSAL CRITERIA

The planning committee will review proposals using the below criteria. The process to accept proposals is very selective as there are a limited number of slots available. Presentations **MUST**:

- Be designed with <u>clear, measurable, and achievable learning objectives</u>;
- Be thought-provoking and action-oriented;
- Utilize <u>person-centered</u>, <u>recovery-focused language</u>; and
- Fit one of two time frames:
 - 1.5 hours: minimum of 80 minutes for presenting and up to 10 minutes for Q&A; or
 - 2 hours: minimum of 105 minutes for presenting and up to 15 minutes for Q&A; and
- Be conducted with no more than three presenters*.
- *The planning committee prioritizes the inclusion of presenters with lived experience.
