Julie Son Recognized as Team Kentucky All Star and DCBS Superhero

Julie Son of The Lakes Service Region was recently recognized as a Team Kentucky All Star by Gov. Andy Beshear and as a DCBS Superhero for her service to her community and her neighbors.

Gov. Andy Beshear featured Julie, a Field Services Supervisor in Caldwell County, and her 16-year-old son, Michael Drennan, in his annual Budget Address to the Commonwealth on Jan. 13 for coming to the aid of her Princeton neighbors immediately after tornadoes ravaged their community on Dec. 10.

As soon as the storm passed through the area, Julie and Michael searched the neighborhood in to find survivors.

"They heard a gentleman crying out for help to escape from a collapsed home that still had 12 people trapped in the basement," Gov. Beshear described. "They searched through the debris to rescue them all, including five kids, one just 3 months old. Julie then provided shelter for so many of the survivors."

Julie and Michael brought these individuals to their home where they wrapped them in blankets,

provided first-aid kits, goodie bags and shelter. Some stayed until they were reunited with other family members, while others were taken to a medical location for treatment.

At this point of the storm, there was no easy way for rescue teams to access their location due to downed trees, powerlines and debris. Julie and Michael continued to search for and save as many people as possible. Unfortunately, they know of four people that died in their immediate area of the neighborhood.

And, he said, she was back to work at the office Monday morning with her team to assist the influx of in-person customers at the two DCBS offices that she supervises in Caldwell and Lyon counties. Days later she developed bronchitis from being out in the elements of the storm and took a few days off. While the foot traffic at these offices has not been overwhelming, her team was and is prepared.

Commissioner Marta Miranda-Straub said she was honored to meet Julie on a visit to western Kentucky.

"I am so glad she is being lifted for her humanity and great courage. Not all heroes wear capes, and she is certainly one of ours."
