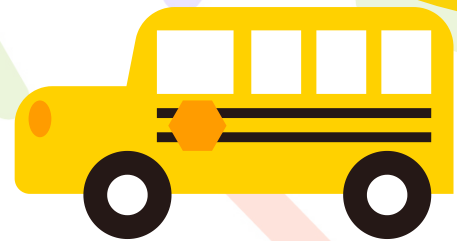


FOLLOW THROUGH

The PEM Facilitator will touch base with the family in a follow-up call 3-4 weeks after the initial meeting. Progress of planned goals/interventions, changes in the client's circumstances, and updates regarding services will be discussed during the follow-up call. The PEM facilitator can make further referrals if needed based on the client's feedback.

Parent Engagement Meetings (PEMs) utilize a strength-based approach, allowing families an opportunity to share their stories and discuss barriers they experience getting their child/children to school.

A PEM facilitator directs the meeting between parents and family resource counselors helping identify resources to overcome barriers experienced.
