Project Abstract Summary

1. Kentucky is applying for the PS18-1802 to implement a comprehensive HIV surveillance and prevention program to prevent new HIV infections; improve health outcomes for persons living with HIV infection, including achieving and sustaining viral suppression; and reduce related health disparities in accordance with the national prevention goals, HIV Care Continuum and CDC's high-impact prevention approach (HIP) by using quality, timely, and complete surveillance and program data to guide HIV prevention efforts. The CDC published "County-Level Vulnerability Assessment for Rapid Dissemination of HIV or HCV Infections Among Persons Who Inject Drugsâ€☐ which highlighted 220 counties in the nation that are most vulnerable to an HIV outbreak similar to the one in Scott County, Indiana, about 30 miles north of Louisville, Kentucky. The counties named in the study are mostly rural, and more than 50% are in Kentucky, Tennessee and West Virginia. Kentucky holds 54 of the vulnerable counties, which is approximately 25% of the 220 identified (including 8 of the top 10 highest risk counties). The Kentucky Department for Public Health HIV/AIDS Branch promotes the prevention of HIV transmission and associated morbidity and mortality by means of: ensuring that all people at risk for HIV infection know their serostatus; that those who are not infected with HIV remain uninfected; that those infected with HIV do not transmit HIV to others; that those infected with HIV have access to the most effective therapies possible; and ensuring a quality professional education program that includes the most current HIV/AIDS information. The Surveillance Program documents and maintains the HIV/AIDS case reports data. The Kentucky Communicable Disease Reporting Regulations (902 KAR 2:020, Section 13) mandate HIV and AIDS case reporting. The Surveillance Program ensures that HIV/AIDS surveillance is a quality, secure system. Component A: Core Program Strategies 1-7 are at 88.2% (required to be 75%) federal funding. Programs target prioritized populations described by the prevention planning process of the Kentucky HIV/AIDS Planning and Advisory Council, the Statewide Coordinated Service Needs (SCSN/Jurisdictional Plan), and the National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHAS). A Data to Care framework will promote cohesion among providers to prioritize populations for interventions and seamless service provision. Anticipated outcomes are earlier identification of HIV positive individuals and notification to their partners, timely linkage to medical services, medication adherence to suppress viral loads and lower CD4 counts. Kentucky desperately needs the maximum funds allowed for PS18-1802 or other funding if there's any hope of providing effective, evidence-based intervention and harm reduction programs in some of the most impoverished and vulnerable counties in the nation.
