WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

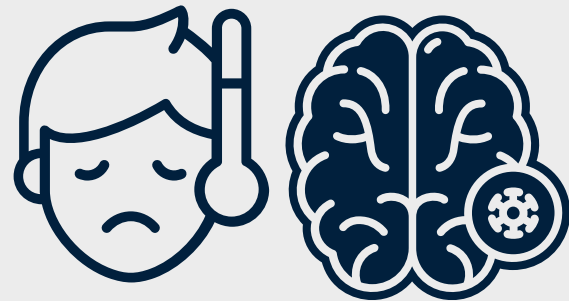
Haemophilus Influenzae type B (HIB) is a bacterial illness that can lead to a potentially deadly infection in young children.

Mostly affecting children under 5 years old.
Meningitis is the most common HIB related illness.

SYMPTOMS:

Meningitis

- Fever
- Cough
- Chills
- Sweating
- Chest pain
- Headache
- Muscle pain
- Shortness of breath
- Excessive tiredness
- Pneumonia
- Hearing loss
- Airway blockage



Spread via coughing, sneezing and other close contact.

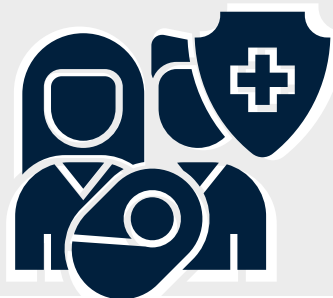
