

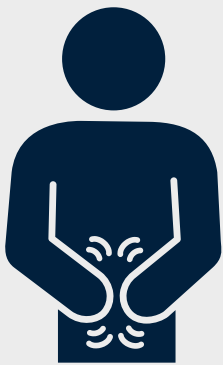
ROTAVIRUS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Rotavirus is a highly contagious virus that causes gastroenteritis in infants and young children.

Enters mouth via feces contaminated hands, surfaces, or objects.

SYMPTOMS:



- Diarrhea
- Vomiting/Upset stomach
- High temperature
- Severe dehydration
- Black or bloody stools
- Irritability
- Slow to move or does not respond



Wash hands thoroughly, especially after using the toilet or changing a diaper.

Typically infects children between 6 and 24 months of age.

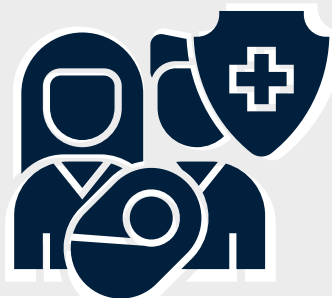
