### Helpful Reminders

- 1099s will be mailed at the end of the month. Please verify your mailing address in [Kentucky's Vendor Self Service System](#). For questions, contact the Kentucky Department of Revenue at 502-564-8639.
- Confirm any 2026 insurance changes with families and share updates with the Service Coordinator for TOTS.
- Agency Administrators must submit updated annual documentation of all attempts to become in-network with insurers for their providers' caseloads.
- Providers leaving or switching agencies must notify their POE manager(s) and the KEIS State Office at least ten business days before their exit. The notice should specify whether they are leaving KEIS, changing agencies (with the new agency's name) or becoming an independent contractor. Providers must also coordinate with service coordinators to ensure new authorizations are in place before resuming services to avoid gaps or billing errors.

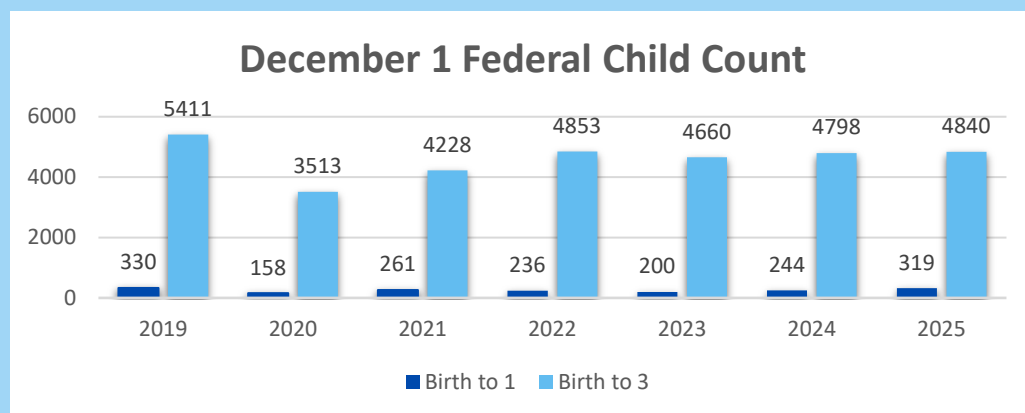

### Coaching Through Strengths: Empowering Caregivers in Everyday Moments

Last month, we described strengths-based practices with reflections from caregivers that highlighted the positive impact KEIS services had on their families. Caregiver coaching in early intervention naturally fits with strength-based practices because it focuses on identifying, using and building upon the existing strengths and abilities of both the caregiver and child. We discover caregiver priorities during joint planning and then observe the caregiver and child interactions during everyday routines to understand what is already working well and where there are opportunities for learning. Reflective questions invite caregivers to share their thoughts about the interactions, helping them think strategically and plan what to try next. Ongoing, supportive feedback reinforces the trusting relationship. In essence, caregiver coaching brings strength-based practices to life by helping caregivers feel empowered, confident and capable of supporting their child's learning and development.

### Growth Reflected in December 1 Child Count



The Part C December 1 child count is an annual federal requirement under IDEA Section 618, which documents the number of children receiving early intervention services, along with their ages and the service settings. KEIS is pleased to report a slight increase from 2024.
