

Gateway District Determination

The Gateway District has scored in the Meets Requirements category for the 6th year.

A determination of **Meets Requirements** means that the district is in compliance in meeting the state targets. This may include correcting any identified non-compliance within one year of notification to the district. The district is not subject to any enforcement action by the state.

Indicators 1, 7 and 8 are compliance indicators. The target is set by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP).

Indicators 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 are performance indicators. These are a measure of the district's overall performance in several key areas. These targets were set during the development of the State Performance Plan (SPP).

These indicators were not included in the overall score for the district due to the lack of reliable data. KEIS anticipates single year age data will be available for FY 2023.
