**The Grade "A" Pasteurized Milk Ordinance has been integrated and adopted by the
Commonwealth of Kentucky under 902 KAR**

50:110. Grade A Milk and Milk Products Standards.

Section 1. (1) Grade A Milk and Milk Products.

The permit requirements, sanitary and quality requirements for the production, processing, handling and distribution of Grade A milk and Milk products as set forth in the publication entitled, "Grade A Pasteurized Milk Ordinance." 1989 recommendation of the United States Public Health Service/Food and Drug Administration is hereby adopted without change.

Section 9. Milk and milk products which may be sold.

From and after twelve (12) months from the date on which this ordinance is adopted, only Grade "A" pasteurized, ultra-pasteurized, or aseptically processed milk and milk products shall be sold to the consumer, to restaurants, soda fountains, grocery stores, or similar establishments. Provided, that in an emergency, the sale of pasteurized milk and milk products, which have not been graded or the grade of which is unknown, may be authorized by the Regulatory Agency, in which case, such milk and milk products shall be labeled "ungraded".

902 KAR 50:120. Unpasteurized goat milk.

The Cabinet for Human Resources is directed by KRS 217C.090 to issue administrative regulations allowing, upon written recommendation of a physician, the sale of goat milk which has not been pasteurized. This administration regulation sets uniform standards for the production, handling, sampling, examination, and sale, at the farm, of goat's milk which has not been pasteurized and for the inspection of the goat farm facilities; and provides for the issuance, revocation, and reinstatement of farm permits.

Section 1. Permits.

No person shall sell or offer for sale unpasteurized goat milk, without first obtaining a permit from the cabinet.
