



INCREASING COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENINGS THROUGH **PARTNERSHIPS**

Through a unique partnership, the Kentucky Department for Public Health and Kentucky Health Care System Partners collaborate to utilize evidence based interventions to improve colon cancer screening in Kentucky.

WHY PARTICIPATE?

Through a federally funded grant from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH) is working with health care system partners across Kentucky to implement evidence-based interventions (EBIs) to increase colorectal cancer (CRC) screening.

Colorectal cancer is preventable through screening. Data from the Kentucky Cancer Registry shows that Kentucky has the **highest** incidence rate and **5th highest** mortality rate for colorectal cancer in the nation. While Kentucky's colorectal cancer incidence and mortality rates have decreased in the past decade, large gaps still remain. Through these partnerships we can address these gaps.

- Completion of annual site visits with KDPH
- Participation in quarterly Learning Collaboratives hosted by the American Cancer Society
- Monthly reporting of CRC data
- Monthly invoice submission of CRC grant-related activities
