


Lung Cancer Screening

What you need to know


Who should get screened?

- ✓ Ages 50 to 80 years old,
- ✓ 20-pack year smoking history (a pack a day for 20 years or equivalent)
- ✓ Currently smoking or have quit within past 15 years



If you said yes to all, you qualify for lung cancer screening, usually covered by insurance.


What is a low-dose CT scan like?



- ✓ Quick and painless
- ✓ No needles, IV or dye
- ✓ Covered by most insurance (Medicare covers 50-77)

What happens next?

- ✓ Your provider or team reviews the scan results
- ✓ You talk with your provider or navigator
- ✓ Keep getting scanned every year
