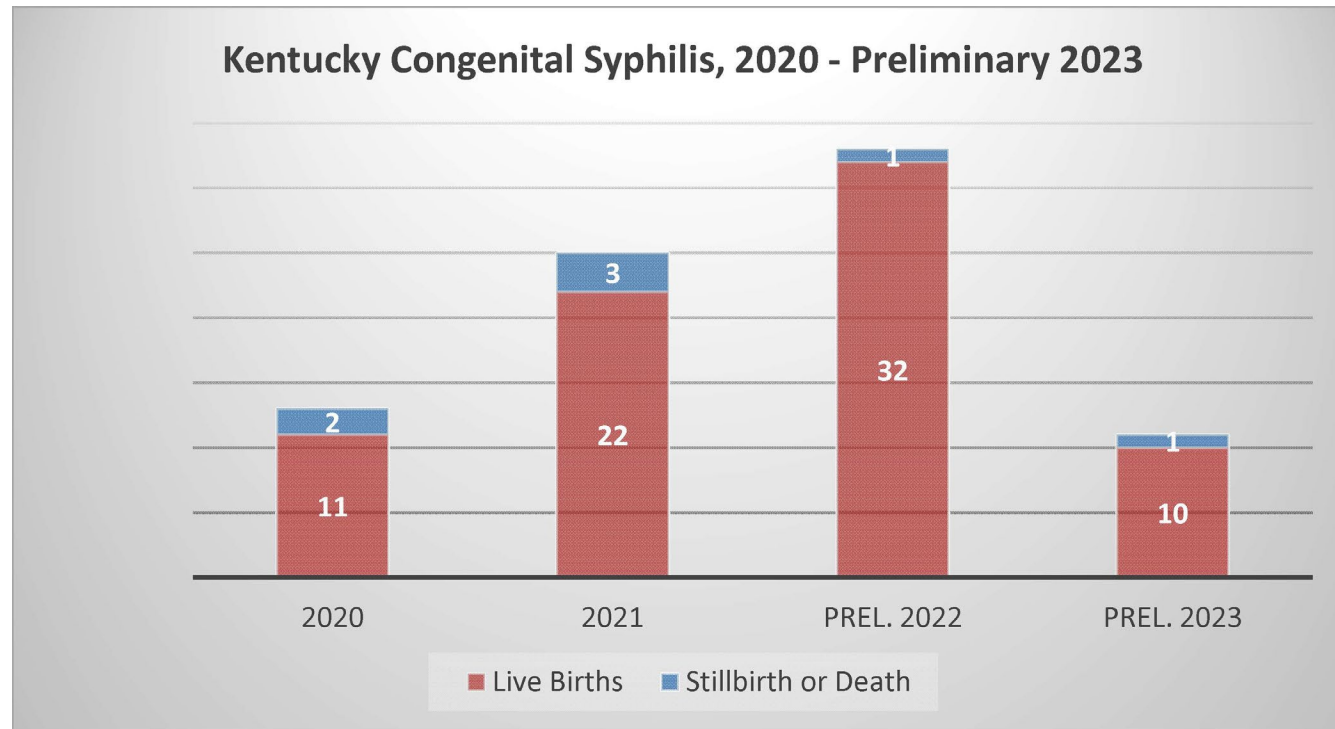

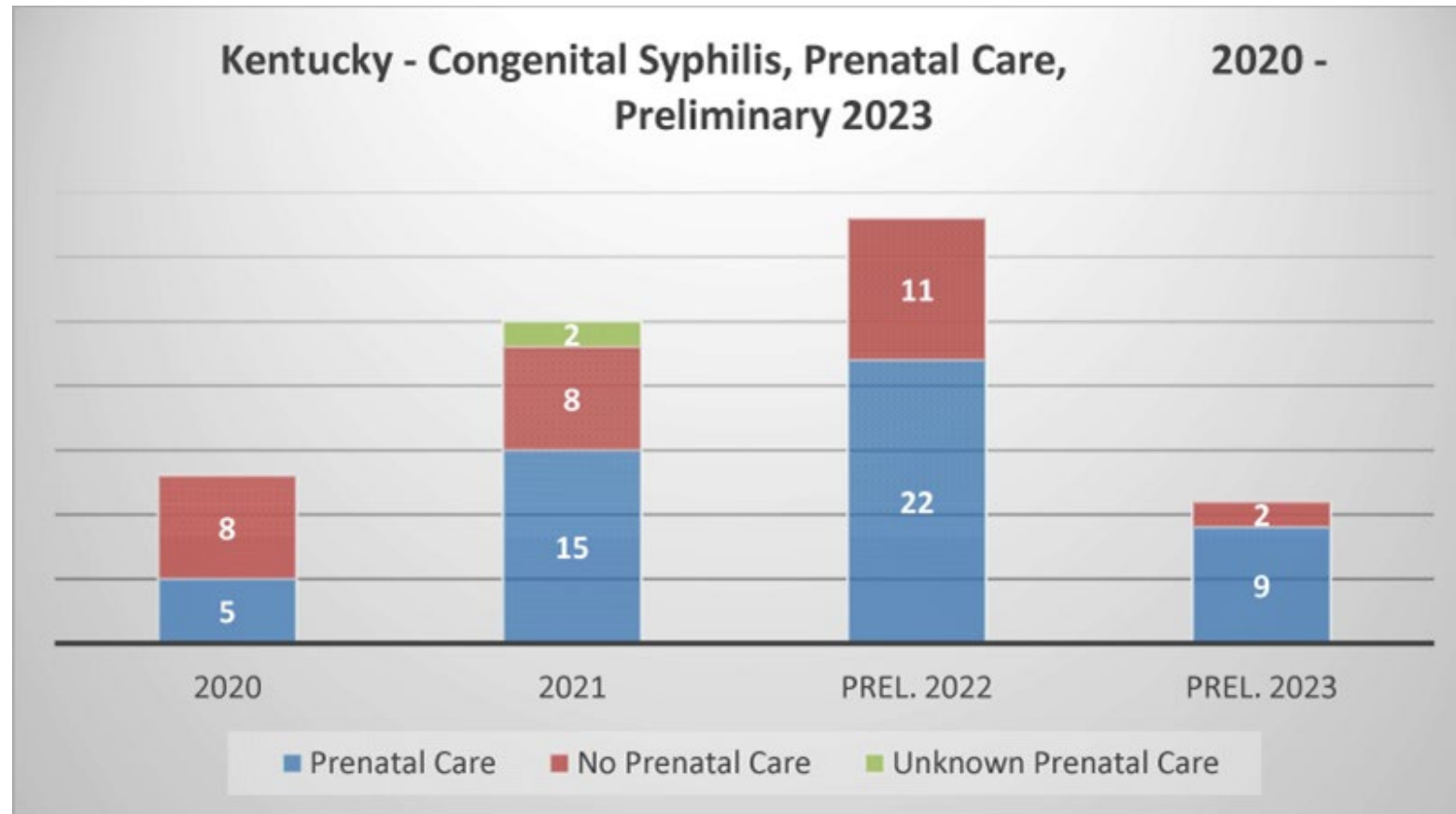

- Gonorrhea – 6820
- Syphilis, early-non primary, non-secondary – 667
- Syphilis, primary – 229
- Syphilis, secondary – 441
- Syphilis, unknown duration or late - 660
