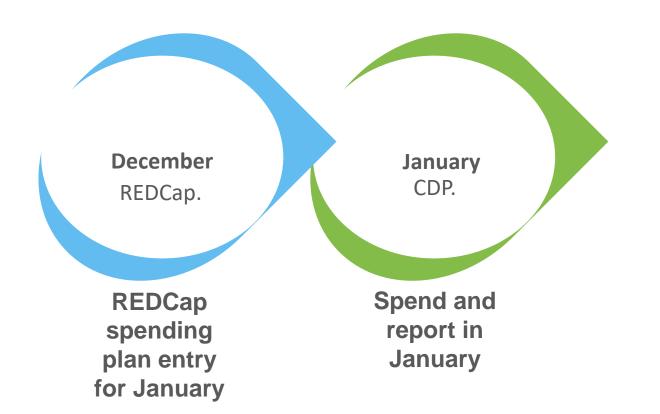

#### **825 LHD Allocations**

To establish, strengthen, maintain relationships with local K-12 schools



#### GOAL

To build infrastructure and partnerships to aid ongoing activities related to prevention and protection efforts with local school boards, schools, and those individuals that learn, work, and play in educational settings.

- 1. Expand, train and sustain a public health workforce
- Strengthen partnerships to enhance K-12 school emergency preparedness, response and recovery capabilities and programs for disease prevention and control.
- Expand partnerships and resources; conduct school-based needs assessments.
- Develop communicable disease/pandemic-related education, prevention and protection materials.
- Coordinate dissemination of accurate, consistent information relevant to school health.

#### PURPOSE

(K-12) Fund local health departments to establish relationships to support collaboration with school systems on preparedness activities.

#### Allowable expenses:

- · Addressing youth mental health needs after a disaster/emergency
- Emergency and public health preparedness, planning, training and exercise activities and supplies for directly related activities
- Education (can include actual classroom activities, printing, and pre-approved emergency preparedness-related signage)
- Indoor Air Quality or other inspections and monitoring equipment
- Personnel Expenses (Non-clinical)
- · In-state travel for directly related activities
- Items on approved resources list, including shipping and handling
- · Stipend used at discretion of LHD as described in monthly survey

#### Items requiring PREAPPROVAL:

- Design for printing, duplication and signage must be preapproved and educational.
- Prevention messaging directly related activities in the form of school and community banners, posters, etc., will be allowable with approval of the design by MCH. However, these cannot be used to advertise private and/or commercial entities, whether or not they are donors.
- All advertising campaigns to promote evidence-based education and prevention programs targeting specific, related community needs must be preapproved.
- Food and/or lodging must be preapproved and directly related to activity.
- Training and related expenses that requires overnight travel will be subject to current DPH travel regulations.

MCH will review other requests on a case-by-case basis

#### CDC Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement (CoAG) OVERVIEW

- In July 2021, KDPH was awarded a two-year grant from the CDC \$13,564,848 each year to establish, expand and sustain a response ready public health workforce.
- Requirements of the funding included spending 25% to support K 12 school health programs.
- Most of the funding was for recruitment, retention, training, and credentialing for public health workforce.
- The CDC guidance stated that every effort would be made to sustain this funding source in the future.
- Allocations are based on a 40% base and 60% population calculation.

#### WFD Grant 25% School Health Allocation

The grant covers the cost of the Division of Maternal and Child Health's School Health Branch Manager and three support positions.

There is a budget of \$3.3M that will go directly to the local health departments to support school health preparedness activities, staffing projects, and health education.

This allocation is intended to cover LHD's expenses for engaging with their local school district for preparedness planning purposes for school year 22-23.

## Reminder: Allowable/Non-Allowable Expenses
