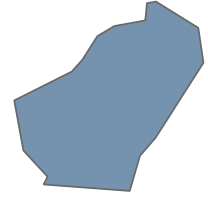

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in Adair County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$187,506 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 77 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,473 people a month in Adair County, stretching over 1,548 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$6,181,693

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Adair County received \$363,300 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$36,753. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Adair County received \$86,225 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 163 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 760 children, collecting \$1,059,776 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 684 orders.

There were 16 children cared for by foster families, 15 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,842.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,171 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 20,518 of the 43,360 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,702 prescribers and 241 dispenser DEA numbers.
