



# **Allen County - Fiscal Year 2023**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$128,592 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 54 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,607 people a month in Allen County, stretching over 1,137 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$4,938,283

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Allen County received \$278,250 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$42,500. Additional grants totaled \$160,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Allen County received \$19,116 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 50 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,004 children, collecting \$2,023,135 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 920 orders.

There were 56 children cared for by foster families, 47 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,555.

23% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,789 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analysesics accounted for 19,768 of the 43,002 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,515 prescribers and 192 dispenser DEA numbers.

Allen County is served by the Lifeskills Community Mental Health Center. Lifeskills received \$9,671,997 in fiscal year 2023.

Lifeskills served 8,568 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Allen is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,112,084 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

#### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 153 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
