


Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Allen County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$177,856 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 53 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 2,750 people a month in Allen County, stretching over 1,181 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Allen County Health Department: \$1,339,186

During fiscal year 2024, in Allen county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 616 participants who received benefits totaling \$580,454.

There are 2 WIC-approved grocers in Allen County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 26 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Allen County received \$271,610 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,102, and 61% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$22,666.

Additional grants totaled \$56,666.

Allen County received \$360,931 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 127 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,033 children, collecting \$2,085,720 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 948 orders.

There were 53 children cared for by foster families, 49 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,276.

35% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 64% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,772 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 19,842 of the 42,944 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,565 prescribers and 179 dispenser DEA numbers.

Allen County is served by the Lifeskills Community Mental Health Center. Lifeskills received \$9,957,965 in fiscal year 2024.

Lifeskills served 8,599 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Allen is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,196,899 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 166 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 232 background checks for children & elderly services in Allen county fiscal year 2024.
