


# **Anderson County - Fiscal Year 2022**

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Anderson County.

## Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$194,499 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 47 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 1,638 people a month in Anderson County, stretching over 717 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$4,369,591

# Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Anderson County received \$768,858 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 4 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 43 children in Out of Home Care, 39 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$3,421.

55% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 44% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

0 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Anderson County received \$316,011 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 106 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 838 children a month, collecting \$1,556,085 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 6 orders.

# Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,000 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 21,013 of the 50,391 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,322 prescribers and 349 dispenser DEA numbers.

Anderson County is served by the New Vista Community Mental Health Center. New Vista received \$14,360,497 in FY 2022.

New Vista served 12,926 individuals in their region.



Anderson is located in the New Vista Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$7,303,465 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 243 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
