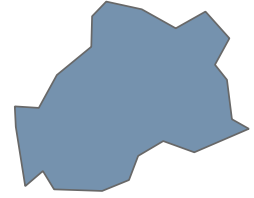

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in Anderson County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$115,389 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 36 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,680 people a month in Anderson County, stretching over 742 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$3,283,406

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Anderson County received \$320,880 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$372,400. Additional grants totaled \$50,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Anderson County received \$28,995 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 60 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 802 children, collecting \$1,482,932 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 720 orders.

There were 55 children cared for by foster families, 36 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,403.

52% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
47% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,046 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 20,688 of the 50,357 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,518 prescribers and 347 dispenser DEA numbers.

Anderson County is served by the New Vista Community Mental Health Center. New Vista received \$15,265,841 in fiscal year 2023.

New Vista served 13,593 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Anderson is located in the New Vista region. This region received \$9,238,392 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 321 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
