### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Ballard County received \$149,256 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 25 children in Out of Home Care, 24 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,253.

24% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

0 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Ballard County received \$107,836 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 36 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 420 children a month, collecting \$731,465 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 27 orders.
