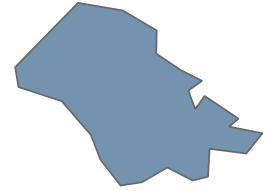

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Bath County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$276,410 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 82 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Bath County received \$387,801 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 5 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 29 children in Out of Home Care, 29 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,346.

31% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

9 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Bath County received \$140,929 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 63 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 829 children a month, collecting \$1,121,906 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 73 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,538 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 14,878 of the 29,933 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Bath County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$7,060,661 in FY 2022.
