Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$519,926 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 178 households in the past fiscal year.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Boone County received \$2,477,756 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 22 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 119 children in Out of Home Care, 112 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$10,625.

18% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
81% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

11 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Boone County received \$3,756,851 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 808 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 4,786 children a month, collecting \$12,319,087 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 236 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 32,942 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 69,854 of the 201,301 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 4,713 prescribers and 415 dispenser DEA numbers.

### Syringe Services Programs

Boone County is served by the Northkey Community Mental Health Center. Northkey received \$8,417,964 in FY 2022.

Northkey served 11,278 individuals in their region.



Boone is located in the Northkey Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$3,271,755 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

## Public Protection
