Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Boone County received \$1,380,960 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,328,179. Additional grants totaled \$204,500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Boone County received \$438,307 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 614 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 4,677 children, collecting \$11,790,726 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 4,122 orders.

There were 108 children cared for by foster families, 87 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$7,917.

9% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 90% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
