Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 32 members in Boyd County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Boyd County received \$1,104,815 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 14 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 214 children in Out of Home Care, 154 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$12,972.

42% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 57% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

8 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Boyd County received \$572,660 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 263 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 2,042 children a month, collecting \$2,709,717 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 117 orders.
