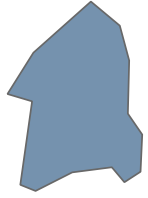

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 29 members in Boyd County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$532,506 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 213 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 6,917 people a month in Boyd County, stretching over 3,285 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$13,611,396

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Boyd County received \$750,330 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$673,244. Additional grants totaled \$119,795. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Boyd County received \$49,174 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 168 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,978 children, collecting \$2,595,695 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,840 orders.

There were 189 children cared for by foster families, 135 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$11,459.

34% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
65% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 13,427 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 42,874 of the 100,735 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,213 prescribers and 335 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs Ashland Boyd County Health Department

Boyd County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$6,633,297 in fiscal year 2023.

Pathways served 12,918 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Boyd is located in the Pathways region. This region received \$3,006,898 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 653 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
