


Breathitt County - Fiscal Year 2022

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$421,169 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 122 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 3,841 people a month in Breathitt County, stretching over 1,956 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$10,241,352

The Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program assisted 106 patient(s) with 274 prescriptions and the amount of money saved in prescription costs was \$568,646 in Breathitt County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Breathitt County received \$536,392 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 5 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 40 children in Out of Home Care, 40 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,595.

25% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 75% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Breathitt County received \$187,396 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 75 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,052 children a month, collecting \$1,153,458 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 52 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,299 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 26,417 of the 48,648 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,119 prescribers and 212 dispenser DEA numbers.
