


Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$342,794 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 117 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,990 people a month in Breathitt County, stretching over 2,015 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$8,006,267

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Health Services

Funding to Breathitt County Health Department: \$1,704,212

Your county has 608 participants who received benefits totaling \$371,226.

Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program (KPAP)

The KPAP helped 190 patients in Kentucky with 776 prescriptions to save a total of \$1,819,215 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Breathitt County received \$303,240 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,301,300. Additional grants totaled \$54,910. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Breathitt County received \$26,067 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 54 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,026 children, collecting \$1,069,368 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,045 orders.

There were 96 children cared for by foster families, 94 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$5,867.

12% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 87% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,312 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analysesics accounted for 24,380 of the 46,092 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,147 prescribers and 228 dispenser DEA numbers.

Breathitt is located in the Kentucky River region. This region received \$3,332,101 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
