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

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)				

Breckinridge County received \$381,570 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$80,836. Additional grants totaled \$11,250. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Breckinridge County received \$20,834 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 52 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,137 children, collecting \$1,609,904 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 979 orders.

There were 41 children cared for by foster families, 34 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,394.

29% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 70% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
