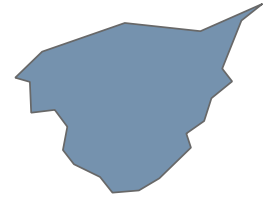

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Bullitt County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$597,359 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 166 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Bullitt County received \$1,231,965 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 14 full-time staff and 4 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 121 children in Out of Home Care, 102 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$10,559.

34% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
65% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Bullitt County received \$2,050,429 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 525 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 2,720 children a month, collecting \$5,454,839 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 104 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 23,500 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 70,593 of the 165,666 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 4,326 prescribers and 461 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Bullitt County is served by the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center. Seven Counties received \$22,200,523 in FY 2022.

Seven Counties served 25,555 individuals in their region.



Bullitt is located in the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$5,335,241 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
