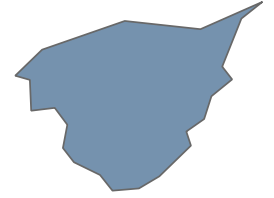

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in Bullitt County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$474,367 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 172 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 5,531 people a month in Bullitt County, stretching over 2,473 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$10,916,863

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Bullitt County received \$1,085,700 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$242,047. Additional grants totaled \$18,300. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Bullitt County received \$233,020 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 392 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,617 children, collecting \$5,125,078 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 2,437 orders.

There were 123 children cared for by foster families, 100 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$11,444.

23% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

**Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)**  
  
According to KASPER data, 23,645 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 68,658 of the 166,030 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.  
  
Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 4,422 prescribers and 480 dispenser DEA numbers.

Bullitt County is served by the Seven Counties Community Mental Health Center. Seven Counties received \$21,081,935 in fiscal year 2023.  
  
Seven Counties served 24,476 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.

 Bullitt is located in the Seven Counties region. This region received \$6,539,897 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

## Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 575 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
