Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$115,500 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 48 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,603 people a month in Caldwell County, stretching over 722 households.

#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Caldwell County received \$189,000 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$40,824. Additional grants totaled \$2,500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Caldwell County received \$12,952 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 33
providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 656 children, collecting \$1,174,091 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 605 orders.

There were 40 children cared for by foster families, 26 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,416.

62% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 37% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

#### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,893 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 11,477 of the 29,030 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,080 prescribers and 192 dispenser DEA numbers.

Caldwell County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$6,103,744 in fiscal year 2023.

Pennyroyal served 8,633 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Caldwell is located in the Pennyroyal region. This region received \$815,726 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

#### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 187 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
