Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$161,109 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 47 households in the past fiscal year.

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Health Services

Funding to Pennyrile District Health Department: \$3,632,698

During fiscal year 2024, in Caldwell county there were 4 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 341 participants who received benefits totaling \$318,100.

There are 3 WIC-approved grocers in Caldwell County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Caldwell County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,911, and 55% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$76,230. Additional grants totaled \$5,000.

Caldwell County received \$313,031 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 91 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 660 children, collecting \$1,180,750 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 598 orders.

There were 19 children cared for by foster families, 6 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$586.

73% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 26% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,162 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,061 of the 29,759 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,095 prescribers and 193 dispenser DEA numbers.

Caldwell County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$7,547,029 in fiscal year 2024.

Pennyroyal served 9,127 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Caldwell is located in the Pennyroyal region. This region received \$877,399 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 86 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 153 background checks for children & elderly services in Caldwell county fiscal year 2024.
