

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Calloway County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$261,790 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 89 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 2,899 people a month in Calloway County, stretching over 1,298 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$7,805,955

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Calloway County received \$785,287 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 0 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 86 children in Out of Home Care, 81 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$4,744.

27% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

2 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Calloway County received \$566,381 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 176 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,322 children a month, collecting \$2,096,336 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 52 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 10,046 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 26,695 of the 74,789 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,420 prescribers and 238 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Calloway County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$5,880,363 in FY 2022.

Four Rivers served 9,010 individuals in their region.



Calloway is located in the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$939,279 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

Public Protection

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 338 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
