


# **Calloway County - Fiscal Year 2024**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Calloway County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$336,483 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 92 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 3,171 people a month in Calloway County, stretching over 1,425 households.

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# **Health Services**

Funding to Calloway County Health Department: \$993,014

During fiscal year 2024, in Calloway county there were 14 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline),
QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 786 participants who received benefits totaling \$650,916.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Calloway County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 48 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

# Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Calloway County received \$489,577 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 5,033, and 53% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$504,153. Additional grants totaled \$13,700.

Calloway County received \$930,476 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 275 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,344 children, collecting \$1,977,879 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,246 orders.

There were 58 children cared for by foster families, 48 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,797.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

## Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 10,839 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 27,965 of the 78,021 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,477 prescribers and 245 dispenser DEA numbers.

Calloway County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$7,247,573 in fiscal year 2024.

Four Rivers served 8,324 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Calloway is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,585,068 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 380 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 477 background checks for children & elderly services in Calloway county fiscal year 2024.
