

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 16 members in Campbell County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$641,314 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 195 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Campbell County received \$2,020,978 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 12 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 381 children in Out of Home Care, 311 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$28,414.

71% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 28% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

6 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Campbell County received \$2,522,055 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 586 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 4,051 children a month, collecting \$6,936,667 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 113 orders.
