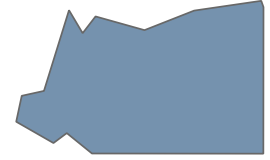

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Carlisle County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$16,108 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 7 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 549 people a month in Carlisle County, stretching over 227 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$1,054,981

During fiscal year 2024, in Carlisle county there were 2 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Carlisle County received \$93,081 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 750, and 54% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$20,000. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Carlisle County received \$166,286 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 41 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 194 children, collecting \$343,827 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 199 orders.

There were 24 children cared for by foster families, 19 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,252.

29% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
70% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,446 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,574 of the 10,769 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 499 prescribers and 89 dispenser DEA numbers.

Carlisle County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$7,247,573 in fiscal year 2024.

Four Rivers served 8,324 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Carlisle is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,585,068 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 54 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 26 background checks for children & elderly services in Carlisle county fiscal year 2024.
