Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Carroll County received \$189,274 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 4 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 23 children in Out of Home Care, 14 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$852.

17% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 82% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

3 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Carroll County received \$216,126 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 68 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 786 children a month, collecting \$1,350,928 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 44 orders.
