


## **Carroll County - Fiscal Year 2023**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Carroll County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$125,998 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 45 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,502 people a month in Carroll County, stretching over 617 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$3,029,497

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#### **Health Services**

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Carroll County received \$189,000 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$31,955. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Carroll County received \$20,470 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 41 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 774 children, collecting \$1,426,331 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 764 orders.

There were 35 children cared for by foster families, 25 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,607.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

#### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,070 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 9,754 of the 21,645 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,532 prescribers and 206 dispenser DEA numbers.

Carroll County is served by the Northkey Community Mental Health Center. Northkey received \$8,678,407 in fiscal year 2023.

Northkey served 10,269 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Carroll is located in the Northkey region. This region received \$4,418,366 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

#### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 158 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
