Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Carter County received \$474,180 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$553,768. Additional grants totaled \$137,250. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Carter County received \$21,639 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 57 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,517 children, collecting \$2,158,190 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,444 orders.

There were 59 children cared for by foster families, 47 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,742.

27% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

7 child(ren) adopted

72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
