Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 5 members in Casey County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Casey County received \$390,429 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 18 children in Out of Home Care, 15 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,567.

11% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 88% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Casey County received \$339,165 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 120 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 793 children a month, collecting \$1,237,184 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 31 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,343 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 17,775 of the 36,573 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,346 prescribers and 222 dispenser DEA numbers.

Casey County is served by the Adanta Community Mental Health Center. Adanta received \$5,615,078 in FY 2022.

Adanta served 7,775 individuals in their region.



Casey is located in the Adanta Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,375,293 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
