Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Casey County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$310,905 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 80 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 2,915 people a month in Casey County, stretching over 1,307 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Lake Cumberland District Health Department: \$10,844,684

During fiscal year 2024, in Casey county there were 5 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 437 participants who received benefits totaling \$404,175.

There are 2 WIC-approved grocers in Casey County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 10 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Casey County received \$238,957 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,200, and 72% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$701,548.

Additional grants totaled \$0.

Casey County received \$854,402 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 198 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 771 children, collecting \$1,048,828 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 720 orders.

There were 19 children cared for by foster families, 15 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,689.

10% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 89% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,567 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 18,266 of the 38,503 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,371 prescribers and 227 dispenser DEA numbers.
