### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Christian County received \$1,008,630 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$193,165. Additional grants totaled \$500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Christian County received \$270,228 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 521 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 3,991 children, collecting \$7,999,886 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 3,575 orders.

There were 112 children cared for by foster families, 85 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$6,934.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
