

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Clay County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$719,564 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 197 households in the past fiscal year.

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Health Services

Funding to Cumberland Valley District Health Department: \$2,837,854

During fiscal year 2024, in Clay county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 632 participants who received benefits totaling \$681,204.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Clay County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 36 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Clay County received \$443,990 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,933, and 74% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$166,853.

Additional grants totaled \$214,478.

Clay County received \$100,757 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 39 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,288 children, collecting \$1,118,356 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,472 orders.

There were 53 children cared for by foster families, 36 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,822.

52% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

47% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,360 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 49,882 of the 102,500 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,628 prescribers and 251 dispenser DEA numbers.

Clay County is served by the Cumberland River Community Mental Health Center. Cumberland River received \$6,306,135 in fiscal year 2024.

Cumberland River served 10,682 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Clay is located in the Cumberland River region. This region received \$1,978,335 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

The Office of Inspector General completed 186 background checks for children & elderly services in Clay county fiscal year 2024.
