

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$196,647 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 64 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 2,257 people a month in Clinton County, stretching over 1,032 households.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Clinton County received \$330,391 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 5 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 9 children in Out of Home Care, 3 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$72.

100% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 0% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Clinton County received \$344,881 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 119 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 555 children a month, collecting \$700,038 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 13 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,876 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 13,072 of the 25,681 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 822 prescribers and 120 dispenser DEA numbers.

Clinton County is served by the Adanta Community Mental Health Center. Adanta received \$5,615,078 in FY 2022.

Adanta served 7,775 individuals in their region.



Clinton is located in the Adanta Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,375,293 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
