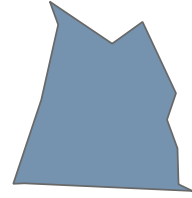

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Clinton County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$254,113 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 63 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,476 people a month in Clinton County, stretching over 1,149 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$4,704,660

During fiscal year 2024, in Clinton county there were 3 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Clinton County received \$228,568 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,533, and 73% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$173,116. Additional grants totaled \$49,994.

Clinton County received \$1,008,994 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 213 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 512 children, collecting \$633,789 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 431 orders.

There were 20 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$675.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,086 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 14,382 of the 27,648 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
