


Crittenden County - Fiscal Year 2022

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Crittenden County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$97,095 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 31 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 922 people a month in Crittenden County, stretching over 391 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$2,424,599

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Crittenden County received \$213,737 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 15 children in Out of Home Care, 8 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$875.

6% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 93% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Crittenden County received \$161,856 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 61 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 446 children a month, collecting \$940,795 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 29 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,244 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 8,195 of the 18,687 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 712 prescribers and 128 dispenser DEA numbers.

Crittenden County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$5,713,393 in FY 2022.

Pennyroyal served 8,694 individuals in their region.



Crittenden is located in the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$890,663 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
