Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Crittenden County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$121,315 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 31 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 899 people a month in Crittenden County, stretching over 395 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$1,700,151

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Crittenden County received \$95,413 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,350, and 62% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$139,838. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Crittenden County received \$362,442 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 118 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 446 children, collecting \$801,609 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 432 orders.

There were 29 children cared for by foster families, 26 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,210.

24% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
75% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,550 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 9,094 of the 21,384 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 774 prescribers and 139 dispenser DEA numbers.

Crittenden County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$7,547,029 in fiscal year 2024.

Pennyroyal served 9,127 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Crittenden is located in the Pennyroyal region. This region received \$877,399 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

The Office of Inspector General completed 167 background checks for children & elderly services in Crittenden county fiscal year 2024.
