Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Cumberland County received \$211,959 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 36 children in Out of Home Care, 26 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,479.

11% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 88% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Cumberland County received \$101,746 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 45 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 441 children a month, collecting \$445,959 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 23 orders.
