Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$99,083 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 32 households in the past fiscal year.

During fiscal year 2024, in Cumberland county there were 3 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Cumberland County received \$149,269 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,020, and 73% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$32,000. Additional grants totaled \$800.

Cumberland County received \$334,616 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 98 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 380 children, collecting \$425,096 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 346 orders.

There were 5 children cared for by foster families, 4 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$163.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,852 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 7,932 of the 15,893 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 714 prescribers and 134 dispenser DEA numbers.
